

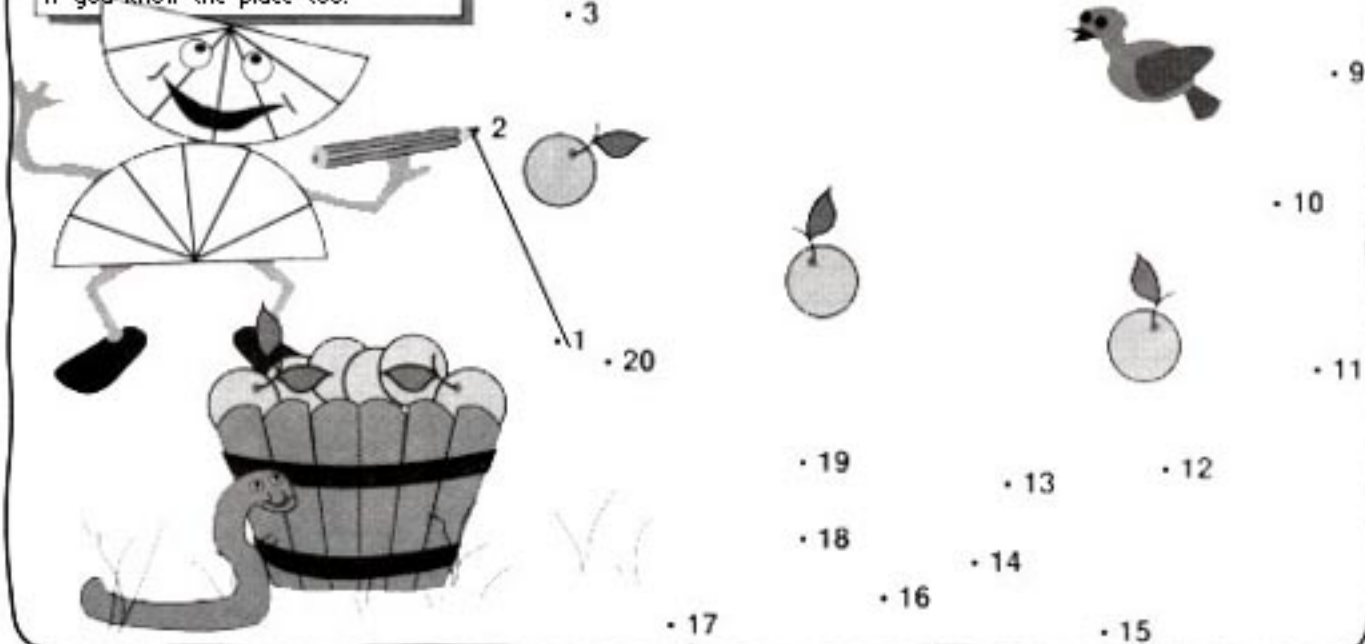

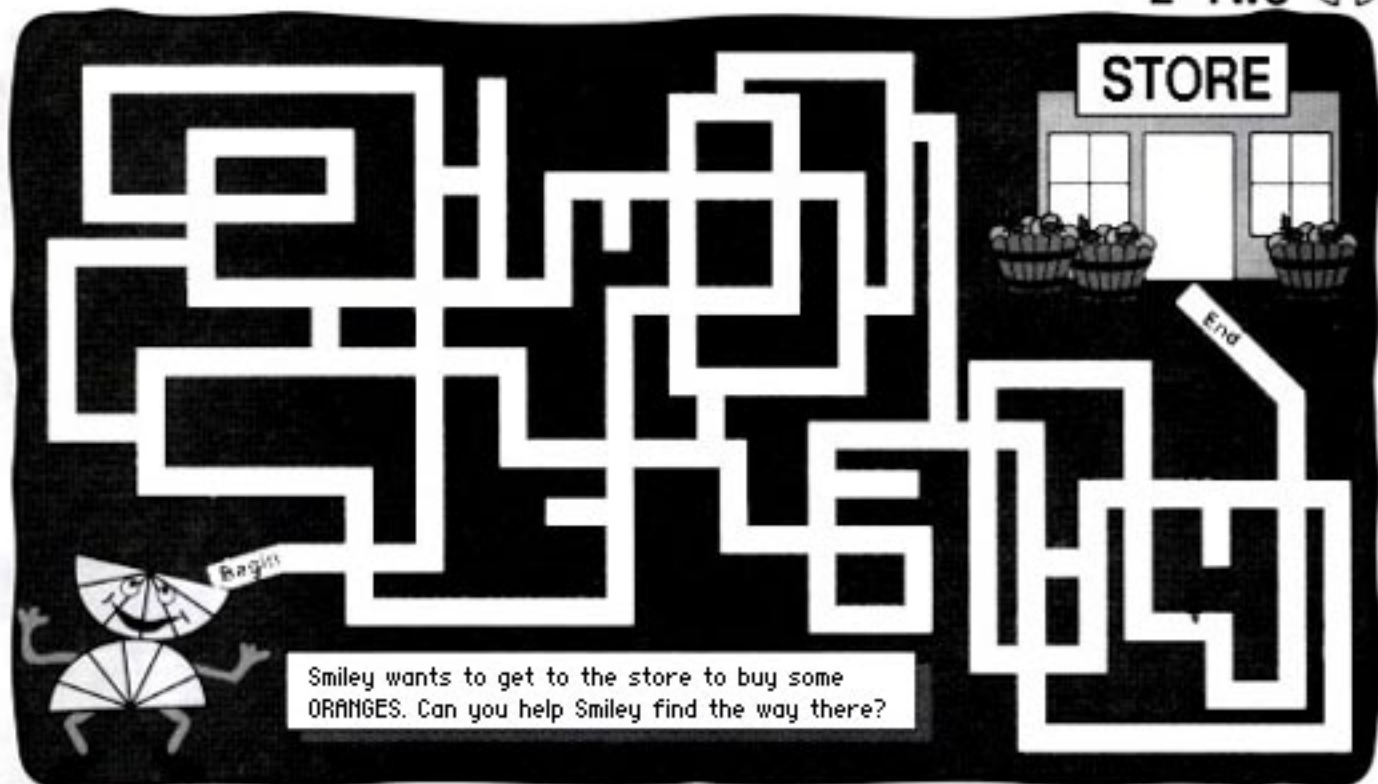

Smiley is looking for more ORANGES and thinks of a place to find some. Help Smiley connect the dots to see if you know the place too.

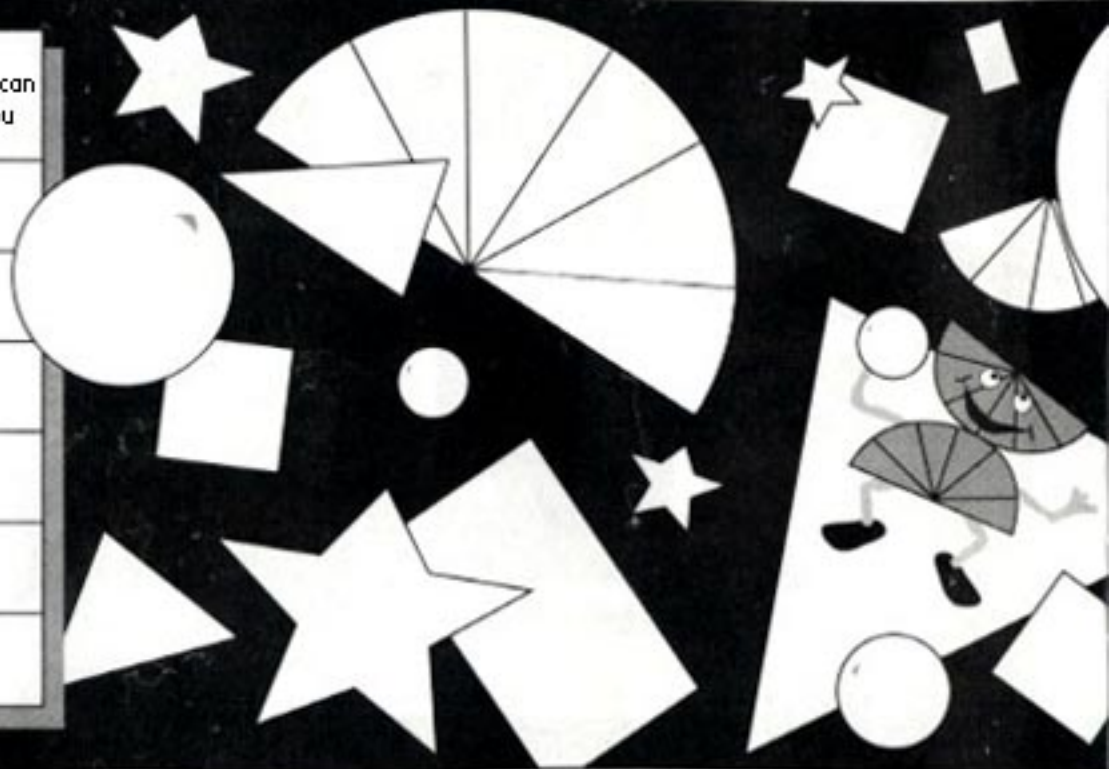


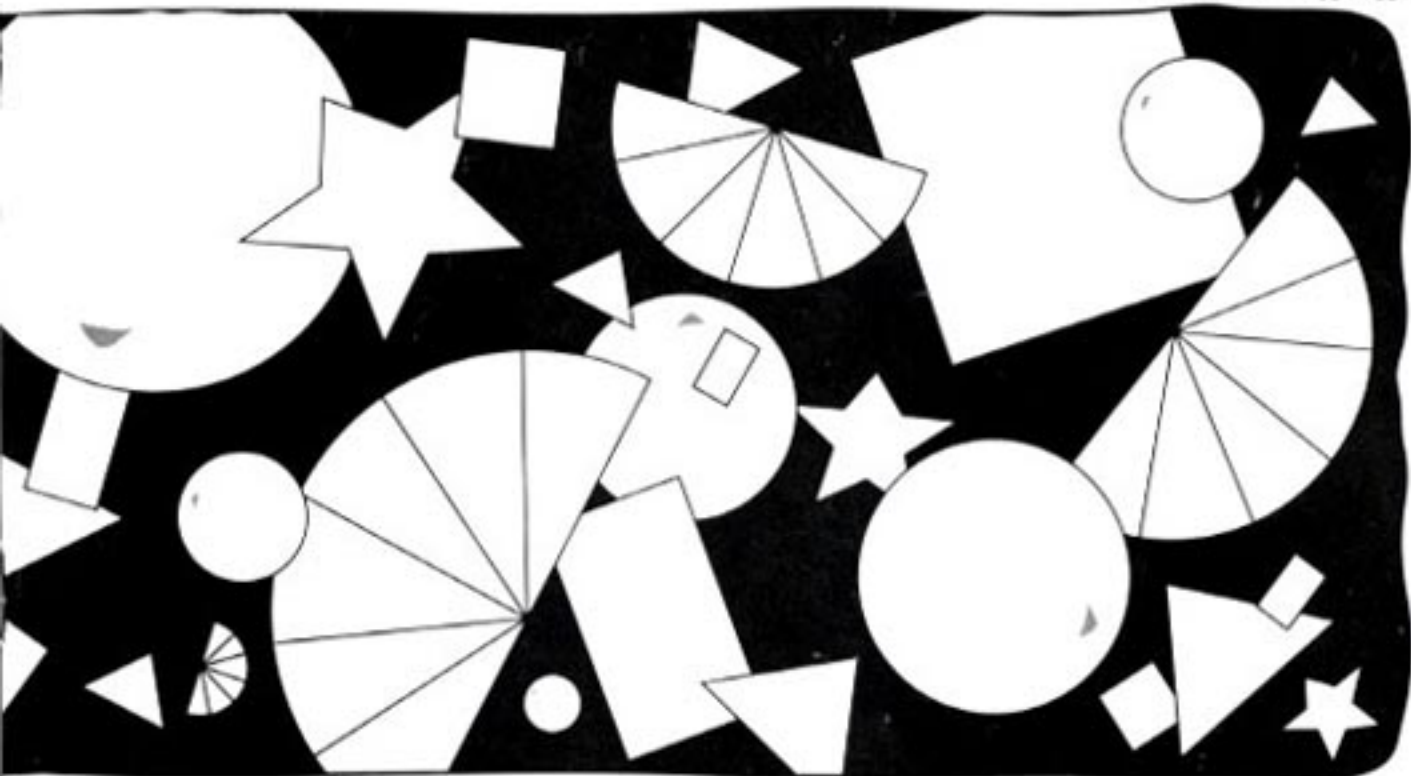

- Share the activities.

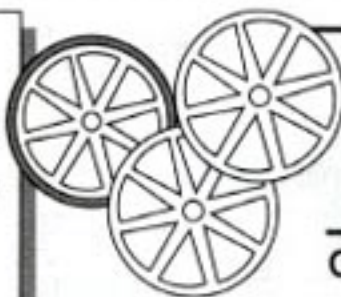
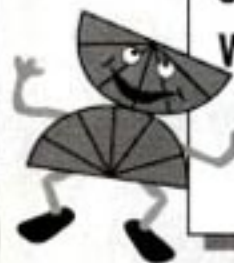
To help your child stay healthy:

Here are some creative ways to serve oranges to your child!



ORANGE SUNS:

Cut a peeled or unpeeled orange into circles.

ORANGE MOONS:

Cut an unpeeled orange into 4 or more wedges.



ORANGE SPACE SHIPS:

Make zig-zag cuts around the middle of an unpeeled orange. Separate into two sections.

ORANGE STAR:

Peel and separate an orange into sections. Arrange wedges in a star-shape on a plate.
